This pamphlet is published as part of the outreach mission of the State of Rhineland-Palatinate. Its use by political parties, by candidates for elective office, and by their assistants for purposes of campaign advertising is prohibited beginning six months prior to an election. This applies to local elections, elections to the state parliament and the lower house of the German parliament, and to European elections. Specifically, during this period distribution of this pamphlet at campaign events or at party information stands shall constitute a violation of the prohibition mentioned above, as shall the insertion, printing or affixing of political-party information or promotional materials. Distribution of this pamphlet to third parties for purposes of campaign advertising is also prohibited. Regardless of temporal relationships to any upcoming elections, this pamphlet may not be used in a manner that could be understood as a statement of solidarity on the part of the State Government on behalf of individual political groups. The parties are permitted to use this pamphlet for purposes of informing their own members.





Discrimination is still a part of everyday life. Each and every day, people are discriminated against for a variety of reasons. Whether based on age, belief, disability, religion or worldview, ethnic origin or sexual identity. There is no shortage of examples.

Perhaps older individuals are not considered for a job opening, or people are turned down in their request for housing due to their Islamic faith. Younger people are not promoted because "it's not their turn yet", or homosexuals are insulted on the basis of their sexual identity.

Discrimination has many faces and can affect each one of us. Because every person has at least a few of the characteristics mentioned above.

In Rhineland-Palatinate we want to live together in an open society and clearly counteract any attempt at discrimination. The purpose of the Anti-Discrimination Agency is to inform, instruct and eliminate doubts so that disadvantages cannot take root in the first place. Its mission is also to help instruct people who are discriminated against about their rights, and to help them defend themselves. We can meet these responsibilities only if all segments of society work together. We are dedicated to achieving this goal.

WHAT IS THE FOUNDATION FOR THE WORK OF THE ANTI-DISCRIMINATION AGENCY?

The work of the Anti-Discrimination Agency is based on the provisions of the General Act on Equal Treatment [Allgemeines Gleichbehandlungsgesetz (AGG)]. Under the Law, no one is permitted to be disadvantaged or harassed on the basis of his or her

- gender
 - age
 - disability
 - ethnic origins
 - religion or worldview
 - or sexual identity,
- whether directly or indirectly.

This applies to the areas of education and occupational training, the labour market and conditions of self-employment, access to professional self-organisations (management and labour), health care and claims to social goods and services, including the allotment of living quarters.



WHAT IS THE ANTI-DISCRIMINATION AGENCY'S MISSION?

The Agency's mission is to counteract and prevent discrimination in all its forms. A number of institutions, associations and organisations are committed to achieving this within the state. The Anti-Discrimination Agency is their main point of contact.

It co-ordinates collaboration, provides assistance e.g. with the extension of points of first contact, and facilitates synergies.

Working with its partners, it develops ideas and projects that protect against discrimination and advances the interests of the state by promoting the diversity of its people.
